FAFP FAMILY PHYSICIAN OF THE YEAR 2023

Diana Twiggs, MD, FAAFP

The FAFP Family Physician of the Year award is provided in recognition of outstanding service as a Family Physician, and acknowledges dedication to the profession and compassion for patients. This year's award is presented to **Diana Twiggs, MD, FAAFP**, of Fernandina, Florida.

Diana Twiggs, MD, has been in practice in Fernandina Beach since 2000. After graduating from Florida State University, she stayed in Tallahassee to complete the PIMS program (Program in Medical Science), a precursor to the FSU College of Medicine, before moving to Gainesville to complete medical school at the University of Florida. After family medicine residency at Halifax in Daytona Beach, she joined her father-in-law, Dr. Donald Twiggs, in medical practice in Fernandina Beach. As the practice evolved over the years, Diana has had roles as a business owner, mentor, instructor, and employed physician.

She has been involved in organized medicine since medical school. Serving as a delegate to the FMA for many years, she also sat on the FMA Board of Governors and several reference committees. She is currently completing a term on the Board of Directors for Baptist Primary Care in Jacksonville. Diana has served as Doctor of the Day in Tallahassee and has been active in communicating with legislators, advocating for patients and family physicians. She has loved the FAFP since medical school and has had several leadership roles, including Board President in 2016.

In addition to her medical career, Diana is active in the community. She and her husband Chris have raised three children: Wesley, Brendan, and Faith. She has actively contributed to her community by volunteering with local choral groups, assisting with coaching her daughter's swim team, and participating in various church activities.

FAFP FAMILY PHYSICIAN Executive 2023

Alina Alvarez, MD, MHA

The FAFP Family Physician Executive award was created to recognize an outstanding family physician for his or her role as a physician executive. This award is reserved for Florida Academy members whose executive skills in health care organizations have contributed to excellence in the provision of high-quality health care, demonstrating that family physicians can greatly impact the nation's health. This award is to recognize exceptional leadership by a full-time family physician executive. This year, the FAFP Family Physician Executive Award goes to **Alina Alvarez, MD, MHA**, of Hialeah, Florida.

Dr. Alvarez, a Cuban immigrant who arrived on the Mariel boat lift, emigrated to the United States with her family in search of a better life. Driven by a passion for medicine and a desire to make a difference, she embarked on a journey that would lead her to become an exceptional healthcare professional.

Dr. Alvarez's journey began at the University of Miami, where she pursued her undergraduate degree. She simultaneously dedicated her free time to AmeriCorps, actively volunteering with the Non-Violence Project and Big Brothers Big Sisters.

While attending medical school and residency, she continued to work in the healthcare field at one of the HCA Florida hospitals as a Quality Manager and Patient Safety Officer. It is at this time that she discovered the intersection of medicine and administration, forgoing a path that would blend her medical expertise with her passion for improving the healthcare system.

During her residency, Dr Alvarez's leadership qualities were recognized and she was chosen to serve as Chief Resident for her Family Medicine Program. She currently serves as Regional Medical Director for Caremax, a value-based care delivery system that utilizes proprietary technology-enabled platform and multi-specialty, whole person health model that delivers comprehensive, preventative, and coordinated care for its over 200,000 Medicare patients in over 10 states.

Beyond her professional achievements, Dr. Alvarez is the proud mother of two young boys ages 7 and 9. Serving as an inspiration to women who strive to pursue their passions while nurturing a family. In her free time, Dr. Alvarez participates in non-profit events that honor first responders.

ART OF MEDICIINE Award 2023

Daniel Van Durme, MD, FAAFP

The Art of Medicine Award is provided in recognition of a physician's compassion, proven by personal example, that the patient receives the full benefit of total care only when the science of medicine is practiced as an art. This year's award is posthumously presented to **Daniel Van Durme, MD, FAAFP,** of Tallahassee, Florida.

Dr. Van Durme, MD, MPH, served as Chair of the Department of Family Medicine and Rural Health at the Florida State University (FSU) College of Medicine in Tallahassee, FL from 2004-2023. He also served as the Director of the College's Center for Global Health. Previously, he spent 15 years in academic medicine at the University of South Florida (USF) College of Medicine and in semi-rural private practice in the Tampa Bay area, where he also worked as the team physician for college and professional sports teams. During his time at FSU and USF he received numerous awards for teaching, service, humanitarianism, and mentoring, including the Sir William Osler Award for Outstanding Faculty Role Model, the USF President's Award for Faculty Excellence and Gold Humanism Honor Society selection.

Dr. Van Durme has held numerous leadership positions including service on the board of directors of the American Academy of Family Physicians, the AAFP Foundation, and FAFP Past President. He was also very active in global health humanitarian efforts and medical education development in several countries, including ongoing work in Nicaragua and Haiti. He received his medical degree at the University of South Florida, did his residency training at Bayfront Medical Center in St. Petersburg, FL, and received his MPH with a concentration in Global Health from Johns Hopkins University. A past president of the Florida Academy of Family Physicians, Dr. Van Durme developed Family Medicine Scholars at FSU to produce specialty leaders of the future. He also served as the first director of the college's rural health program in Marianna, with the intention of helping to develop more physicians who will care for patients in rural areas and small towns.

Dr. Krista Brinkerhoff is a Florida native, born and raised in Ormond Beach. She attended University of South Florida for her undergraduate degree before being accepted into the Florida State University College of Medicine. Dr. Bindas was born in Plymouth, MA and spent most of his childhood in his hometown of Orlando, FL. He attended Florida State University where he got his B.S. in Exercise Physiology and minor in Business. He worked as a Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist and Certified Exercise Physiologist prior to getting into the University of South Florida (USF) Morsani College of Medicine.
